## IS YOUR RABBIT BEHAVING BADLY?

As a popular choice of pet, rabbits are usually bought in the hope that they will provide the same level of companionship as a dog or a cat. In the right conditions this is certainly possible, however many rabbits can develop unforseen problems like nervousness, aggression, inappropriate toilet training, marking behaviour and destructive behaviour. The possible causes of these problems are many and varied and thus an accurate diagnosis needs to be established to enable an appropriate treatment programme to be developed.

The Rabbit Behaviour Advisory Group was formed by Emma Magnus, Anne McBride and Georgie Hearne who are all members of the Association of Pet Behaviour Counsellors. If you are having problems with your rabbit's behaviour take this card to your veterinary surgeon and ask for a referral.
